

Coaches' Notes - October 2021

Your Sturgeon Heights Instructional Learning Coaches certainly enjoy working with your children and their teachers. Our focus this fall has centered around literacy. We are fortunate to have our school library undergoing refurbishment; students have access to a wonderful collection of books at school. Each school day, Sturgeon Heights students have opportunities to build their oral, reading, and writing skills. Thank you for the time you take to listen to your child's ideas, point-out print all around us, and read with your child.

Wellness News

Ms. Johansson has been in all grades from Kindergarten to grade 9 over the past month, presenting and

modelling lessons based on social emotional learning competencies. In Kindergarten to grade 2, she is using the Kimochis program. Students are learning to identify emotions and talk about ways to express them. They have focused on happy vs. sad feelings, and then worked on kind, proud and friendly feelings. Classroom "Kindness Detectives" have been observing and reporting all the acts of kindness and friendly signals from their class cohorts.

In grades 3 to 6, students are learning about how our values are like an internal compass. When we use a compass correctly, it helps us to get where we want to go; when we honor our own and others' values, it helps us to stay true to ourselves and feel content with our lives. In junior high, Ms. Johansson has been team teaching with Ms. Oswald, covering a variety of topics related to self-awareness, respect and inclusive behavior.




As Learning Coach for grades 5-9, Ms. Johansson has been working with students to learn and apply assistive technology, often in the context of wellness health classes. Junior high has also had some practice using OrbitNote and Read and Write in their math classes to "show their work" by voice recording their thinking about the solution to math problems. Students have begun to test speech-to-text headphones for use with the assistive technology. In the coming week, each classroom will receive some of the newly purchased headsets for use in class. We are still encouraging students to have their own for consistent use. Here is a link for the inexpensive, comfortable speech-to-text headphones we will be using:

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TIPS and TOOLS for student learning:

Parents, as you make time to read with your child at home, don't feel that each reading encounter needs to push your child to "work hard" reading difficult texts. Reading development progresses more effectively when children enjoy their reading experiences. Reading to your child, models fluency and helps them with vocabulary-building. When you read aloud to your child they have the opportunity to encounter rich text and build vocabulary. Playing with words, singing rhymes, and sharing jokes are all literacy development experiences too. When you make literacy building a positive experience at home, we make a great team!

For older children, a recent example of the need for critical literacy was evident in our October 2021 election plebiscite questions. Plebiscite question 1 asked:

Should section 36(2) of the Constitution Act, 1982 – Parliament and the government of Canada's commitment to the principle of making equalization payments – be removed from the constitution? To vote against making equalization payments, the voter had to select "yes". Critical readers could identify the subject and verb in this lengthy question, and then the answer would be evident.

We have a lot of work to do to prepare our children to become literate active citizens. Making time to discuss these types of real-life literacy situations benefits older students. Your learning coaches encourage you to watch for such examples of real-life literacy practice and work on them with your families.

Wonder if they were friends with our Creepy Pumpkin?




